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How long sanctions will be published for

UKPHR's registration standards and rules relating to registrants' conduct are set out in its *Fitness to Practise Rules* which relate to the responses the Registrar and/or a Fitness to Practise Panel may impose on a registrant as a result of consideration of a registrant's health, conduct or competence.

The outcome of such consideration, where any sanction (from warning or guidance given to removal of name from the register) is imposed will be recorded on the public register.

In this publication we set out how long the record of the sanction will remain on UKPHR's public register.

The time limits are set out in the **three tables** below. Please refer to the heading of each table in order to identify the relevant table and therefore the appropriate time limit.

Registration was erased by Fitness to Practice Panel	10 years from the date of erasure
Registrant who received a sanction other than erasure	5 years from the date the registrant left the register (subject to relevant 10 and 15 year maximum periods)
Registrant who received a finding of impaired fitness to practise but no sanction	1 year from the date the registrant left the register (subject to 5 year maximum period)
Registrant who received suspension, conditions or undertakings solely on the grounds of ill health	1 year from the date the registrant left the register (subject to the sanction still being active)

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
